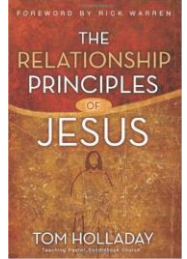


The Relationship Principles of Jesus – by Tom Holladay

Key Points

In every good book there are some sentences that stand out as you read as real “bell ringers”. Jot down those sentences and their page numbers for future reference.

My Personal Take Away Truths

List “take away” truths, decisions, commitments and or tasks to accomplish that have come to mind because of the information you have gained from this book.
